About ABC for Health:

ABC for Health is a Wisconsin based nonprofit public interest law firm dedicated to linking children and families, particularly those with special health care needs, to health care benefits and services.

ABC for Health's mission is to provide information, advocacy tools, legal services, and expert support needed to obtain, maintain, and finance health care coverage services.

Extending Our Research:

In a continuation of our previous medical debt and collections research,¹ ABC for Health conducted a comprehensive review of circuit court records to compile data on medical debt lawsuits filed by the Children's Hospital of Wisconsin from January 2020 – November 10, 2021 (the drafting of this report). The goal of this research was to gain insight into the effect of the COVID-19 pandemic on medical debt collection.



Our Findings:

Children's Hospital of Wisconsin filed <u>no</u> new collections actions against patients during the COVID-19 pandemic.

- As part of our prior research,¹ from 2017 through 2019, Children's Hospital of Wisconsin filed **1347** lawsuits against patients seeking a total of \$**1,930,809.67**.
- From January 2020 -November 10, 2021, Children's has filed **0** new collections lawsuits against patients.

Future Practices:

What Children's post-pandemic practices will be are of course unknown. As of drafting this update (11/10/21), Children's has not initiated any new collections actions against patients since before start of the pandemic. We hope that this pattern continues, signaling the end of Children's medical debt collection practices against patients.
